HABEAS CORPUS ARBITRARY DETENTION EXECUTIVE POWER

... will be before the Supreme Court

On December 5, the U.S. Supreme Court will hear a case of critical importance – Al Odah v. United States/ Boumediene v. Bush. This case marks the third time the fundamental rights of Guantanamo detainees have been brought before the Supreme Court – and the third time the Bush Administration has asserted an unqualified right to trample the Constitution and detain people indefinitely without charge or a fair hearing.
